QUARTERLY SUMMARY

3rd QUARTER 2022

July 1--September 30

Crime Summary:

In the third quarter of 2022, there was a **1.4% decrease** in overall crime compared to the second quarter of 2022. There was a slight decrease in shoplifting, burglaries, vandalisms, and thefts from buildings. Increases were seen in robberies and assaults. This quarter response times to emergency calls for service was 2:56 minutes, and there were a total of 8,804 incidents handled by police personnel.

Patrol Division

- Officers were involved in a vehicle pursuit of several theft suspects who had stolen merchandise from a local retail store. The suspects were apprehended by officers and over \$5000 of store merchandise was recovered.
- Officers arrested a robbery suspect who stole cash from a convenience store.
- Officers observed a burglary in-progress occurring at a shopping center, resulting in a lengthy vehicle pursuit of the suspects. The suspects threw several explosive devices at pursuing officers as the vehicle pursuit entered the City of LA. The suspects fled, but their vehicle was located a short time later. ESPD detectives are currently investigating the case.
- Officers conducted a street racing enforcement detail. Ten traffic citations were issued.

Special Operations Division

- Five different directed enforcement campaigns were conducted regarding eBike education, crosswalk violations, illegally parked vehicles, and enforcement of vehicles with loud exhaust.
- Top Golf weekend security details were conducted, resulting in numerous business assists with keeping the peace and intoxicated patrons.
- Special Operations personnel was responsible for traffic and participant safety of the Main Street Fair, the Art Walk, the 4th of July event, and the Soap Box Derby.
- Special Operations assumed management responsibilities of the South Bay Regional DUI Task Force. The first DUI deployment was on September 17th.
- Personnel participated in a regional task force combatting illegal street racing.

Investigative Division

- Department investigators conducted active shooter response training for the Department.
- Detectives arrested a subject who shot out the window of a retail store. The firearm used in the crime was recovered.

Community Engagement Division

- A presentation on homeless measures was given at a security meeting.
- A department award was given to several El Segundo students for assisting in an investigation that led to an arrest of individual who was in possession of a firearm.
- Officers conducted several checks at the beach for subjects camping out in tents overnight. One person was issued a citation for overnight camping.
- Coffee with a Cop event was held at Starbucks (Douglas St. and Maple Ave.)
- A successful National Night Out event was held on Main St.
